

Drop in Homeless Families; Rise in Homeless Individuals

The Point in Time (PIT) was held January 31. Staff and volunteers from local nonprofit organizations, social services agencies and public agencies surveyed clients at meal sites, food banks, shelters, outdoor campsites and on the streets, and at the Project Homeless Connect event, counting the area's homeless and offering resource information as needed. School districts also contribute their data to the totals.

• Total number of people with no shelter (outside, in a car, etc.) rose from 176 in 2012 to 190 in 2013

Families: The total number of unsheltered families decreased by 50%. In 2012, there were 22 unsheltered families (66 people) compared to 11 unsheltered families (34 people) in 2013.

Individuals: The total number of unsheltered individuals rose 64% from 88 in 2012 to 144 in 2013. **40 of these individuals were "chronically homeless"** compared to 32 in 2012.

- <u>Total number of people in emergency shelter decreased from 257 in 2012 to 234 in 2013</u>
- Total number of people who are "doubled up" with family or friends and at-risk of homelessness rose from 628 in 2012 to 1127 in 2013.

The good news:

This year's count highlights the community's success in reducing the number of unsheltered families through providing emergency shelter and housing. The slight decrease in the number of emergency shelter reflects the slightly lower demand for shelter this winter season and that individuals and families moved through the shelter system and into housing more quickly.

Still work to be done:

The count also highlights two areas where the community needs to redouble its efforts: working with single adults, many of whom have long histories of homelessness, and connecting at-risk families to job training, education, and other services they need to achieve stable housing.
