Presented by HLC member, Barbe West of the Free Clinic of Southwest Washington The Healthy Living Collaborative is a four county, 41 member, multi-sector initiative designed to improve health (broadly defined) through both community and policy level work. Using the collective impact model, the HLC is the backbone organization facilitating this long term work. Two strategies connect to the CoC work. 1) addressing high utilizers of emergency medical services and 2) creating and funding models to improve education outcomes associated with housing stability.

Housing First Cohort

Clark County, Share, and Council for the Homeless are hosting a three part training on Housing First methodology and service delivery. Representatives from Seattle's Downtown Emergency Service Center (DESC) will lead the sessions.
