## **Data Completeness Report Card for December**

Dale showed the three-month comparison (Oct, Nov, Dec) with % and letter grade. We are at a 96.01%, still an A, down slightly since September. The brighter the green the higher the score. Dale noted that a smaller program where data is missing for one client can significantly skew the results. Call Dale if you need assistance in fixing data.

Dale said we can attach the report and send it out after the meeting.

#### Data Dashboards Review & Updates

- o Review latest Dashboard Outcomes from the website: Navigate by these tabs:
  - CFTH About Homelessness Data and Analysis System Dashboard The dashboard is important for communicating how we are doing as a system and if we are meeting the goals that bring in the funding to our community.
    - Dale showed a video that shows what CoC System measures. Data collection is critical to the overall stability of system coordination. Performance measures better allow a system to serve all clients who are experiencing homelessness and to understand the barriers to exiting.

  - Dale encourages program coordinators to click on each of your programs to see if anything stands out
  - Choose the length of time to view the program
- Example of checking your program outcomes

Dale gave the example of PSH. He noticed 70% chronic move-ins. Since this is a program for chronic homelessness, this number should be 100%. So, it makes him think that some data might be entered incorrectly. Dale wants us to use these dashboards to make improvements in the system. Dale will be in touch with PSH program coordinators.

# 2021 PIT Count Unsheltered/Sheltered Update

- PIT Count is required every year at the end of January. It is comprised of unsheltered and sheltered count. We received a waiver this year for the unsheltered count. Our system will be counting sheltered as usual through HMIS on January 28<sup>th</sup>.
- Typically, we would offer Project Homeless Connect to attract and count. However, in lieu of PHC, we will be collecting supplies and sending them out with Outreach.
