Notes:

1. People in Emergency Shelter increased 83% due to substantial increase in number of Emergency Shelter beds (Bertha's Place and Bertha's Place Too), existing shelters were able to open to full capacity after earlier social distancing restrictions were eased and 2022 was the first year the PIT count date occurred on a Severe Weather night so additional overflow beds were occupied as well.

2. People in TH increased 13% from 2021.

3. Number of sheltered seniors aged 62 or older increased 157% as a result of prioritizing that population for the new Bertha's Place shelters. Unsheltered seniors remained the same # of 37 in both 2022 and 2020.

4. Unsheltered people increased 21% from the 2020 count. No unsheltered count occurred in 2021. This increase was almost all within the Single Individuals and HHs without children side as Unsheltered families decreased 30% from 2020. Unsheltered people in households without adults increased from 2 in 2020 to 18 in 2022. Chronically homeless unsheltered individuals decreased 21% from 2020 and unsheltered veterans decreased 27% from 2020.
