	unable to house and care for their pets. This includes people who are	
	temporarily unhoused or are hospitalized.	
	30 day limit for housing pets.

	Open to dogs, cats, and rabbits.	
	<ul> <li>Spay and neutering at no cost.</li> </ul>	
	The Humane Society is planning to expand the Safe Haven Program to allow	
	for fostering in homes.	
	Help Fund	
	The Help Fund provides assistance to low income individuals who need	
	assistance with medical care. The requirements for Help Fund assistance:	
	Non-preventative care	
	Treatable condition

	Fund availability are dependent on veterinary office participation.	
	Spay and Save Program – free spay and neutering for cats.	
	There will be a pet clinic at <b>Project Homeless Connect</b> for unhoused pet	
	owners. The clinic offers routine physicals, vaccinations, and other	
	prevention services.

	County. The count is an educated guess and even though, it is an	
	undercount, it allows the HCRS to provide 'apples to apples' comparisons	
	each year and helps determine population trends overall.
