Notes:

1. People in Emergency Shelter increased 16% due to the inclusion of an additional winter shelter in 2025 and increases at overflow shelters.
2. People in TH increased 7% from 2024.
3. Number of seniors aged 62 or older increased 21%. This increase was primarily among sheltered seniors. Unsheltered seniors increased by 3 individuals.
4. Unsheltered people increased 11% from the 2024 count. This increase was almost all among single individuals or households without children. Chronically homeless sheltered individuals increased 32% from 2024 while chronically homeless unsheltered individuals increased by 1 person. Unsheltered veterans increased by 1 person. However the total # of veterans counted of 39 remained the same as in 2024.
5. There were 2 less unsheltered families counted in 2025 and 4 more people counted in those families due to larger family sizes.
